Public Works is filling field holes and divots with sand and other materials to flatten the playing areas. HTX will be doing more field maintenance in the spring when the ground is not as hard.*

Commissioners were sent information regarding Phase three renderings and shared their comments, questions, and concerns with city staff prior to the Parks & Recreation Commission meeting. Those thoughts and ideas were then taken to the contractors from city staff. Types of grass being used at the park was discussed as well as potentially adding lots of wildflowers to the park. The commissioners shared their desire to have native grasses at the park.*

**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

A Parks and Recreations Board member has asked city staff to investigate the potential for new development to conduct a wildlife impact study on any remaining undeveloped land within the City of Fulshear prior to any grading or construction. This study would identify whether the property contains endangered or threatened wildlife as well as the habitat upon which they thrive. A possible result of these types of studies could allow the City to ensure that these species and habitats are preserved to an extent that is both beneficial to development and wildlife alike such as creating a space to accommodate such species while meeting green space/open requirements. Additionally, these spaces could be connected by wildlife corridors that could serve to preserve these habitats and specie behavior beyond the boundaries of one particular property.

**ORDINANCE 2026-1524**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FULSHEAR, ADOPTING CHAPTER 8, ARTICLE XVI OF THE FULSHEAR CODE, CREATING A WILDLIFE IMPACT ANALYSIS FOR CERTAIN RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

\*\*\*\*\*

**WHEREAS**, the City is authorized under Texas Local Government Code Chapter 212 to adopt rules governing plats and subdivisions of land within its jurisdiction to promote the health, safety, morals, or general welfare of the municipality and the safe, orderly, and healthful development of the municipality; and

**WHEREAS**, the conservation of wildlife and native habitat is an important component of the general welfare and healthful development of the City, particularly in rapidly urbanizing areas with remaining riparian corridors, floodplains, and native vegetation; and

**WHEREAS**, The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) is charged with administering laws relating to wildlife resources and provides guidance to project proponents on assessing and avoiding impacts to rare and protected species and their habitats; and

**WHEREAS**, TPWD’s technical guidance recommends that, during project planning and prior to construction, project areas be surveyed for potential habitat for rare and protected (endangered or threatened) species, that impacts to such habitats be avoided to the greatest extent practicable, and that coordination occur with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and TPWD where state- or federally-listed species may be adversely affected.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FULSHEAR, TEXAS:**

**Section 1.** – Findings of Fact

All of the facts recited in the preamble to this Ordinance are hereby found by the City Council to be true and correct and are incorporated by reference herein and expressly made a part hereof, as if copied herein verbatim.

**Section 2.** – Section 8-944

The City of Fulshear, Texas, adopts Chapter 8, Article XVI, Section 8-944 of the Fulshear Code as follows with underlines being additions to the code:

## Sec. 8-944. – Applicability

- (1) *Projects Requiring a Wildlife Impact Study.* A Wildlife Impact Study (WIS) is required for any application for plats located within City limits:
  - (a) A new residential subdivision creating fifty (50) or more lots; or
  - (b) A residential subdivision on a gross tract area of fifty (50) acres or more,
- (2) *Exemptions.* This Ordinance does not apply to:
  - (a) Plats that adjust existing lot lines without increasing the total number of buildable lots and without additional land disturbance beyond existing developed areas.
  - (b) Amending plats and minor replats that do not create additional buildable lots or infrastructure and do not involve new disturbance of undeveloped habitat.

### **Section 3.** – Section 8-945

The City of Fulshear, Texas, adopts Chapter 8, Article XVI, Section 8-945 of the Fulshear Code as follows with underlines being additions to the code:

#### Sec. 8-945. – Submittal Requirement and Timing

- (1) *Condition of Completeness.* For any subdivision application subject to 8-944, a WIS shall be submitted as part of a complete application. The City shall not deem a preliminary plat, or a first plat submission where a preliminary plat is not required, complete until a WIS meeting the standards of this Ordinance has been submitted and approved by the Planning Director.
- (2) *Concurrent Review.* The WIS shall be submitted concurrently with the preliminary plat or initial plat application so that wildlife considerations can be integrated into layout, open space configuration, and infrastructure design.
- (3) *Revisions.* If the subdivision design is substantially revised after initial WIS submittal, the Applicant shall supplement or update the WIS to reflect the revised design to the satisfaction of the City Engineer or designee.

### **Section 5.** – Section 8-946

The City of Fulshear, Texas, adopts the Wildlife Impact Study which shall include, at a minimum, the following:

#### Section 8-946. - Minimum Content of Wildlife Impact Study

- (1) Project Description.
  - a. Legal description, acreage, and location of the tract.
  - b. Proposed land uses, number of lots, and general subdivision layout.
  - c. Phasing and anticipated construction schedule, if any.
- (2) Existing Conditions and Habitat Mapping.
  - a. Description of existing land cover and vegetation communities, including identification of riparian corridors, floodplains, wetlands, native grasslands, and wooded areas.
  - b. Mapping of Sensitive Habitat areas on the tract using best available information and field reconnaissance.
  - c. Summary of observed wildlife species and habitat types, with an emphasis on species associated with riparian and wetland habitats or large contiguous habitat patches.
- (3) Rare and Protected Species Review (TPWD-Informed).
  - a. Desktop review of TPWD's Annotated County Lists of Rare Species and other TPWD resources to identify potential state-listed or federally-listed species and rare communities that may occur on or near the tract.
  - b. Identification of any potential habitat for listed or rare species on the tract, based on habitat characteristics and TPWD guidance.
  - c. Discussion of whether the project, as proposed, has reasonable potential to adversely affect such species or their habitats, including fragmentation, loss of habitat, or degradation of riparian or wetland functions.
- (4) Impact Assessment.
  - a. Narrative and, where feasible, quantitative assessment of anticipated direct impacts (clearing, grading, filling, drainage modifications) and indirect impacts (fragmentation, edge effects, lighting, human disturbance) to wildlife and Sensitive Habitat.
  - b. Evaluation of how proposed stormwater and drainage facilities may affect aquatic and riparian habitats used by wildlife.
- (5) Avoidance and Minimization Measures.
  - a. Description of design measures taken to avoid and minimize impacts to Sensitive Habitat, such as clustering development, preserving riparian buffers, and aligning roadways and utilities to avoid high-value habitat consistent with TPWD recommendations to avoid undisturbed native vegetation where practicable.
  - b. Identification and mapping of proposed open space, conservation areas, and buffers intended to protect habitat and maintain connectivity.

Mitigation and Best Management Practices (BMPs).

- a. Recommended mitigation measures for unavoidable impacts, which may include on-site habitat restoration, native vegetation re-establishment, enhancement of wildlife corridors, and wildlife-friendly crossings or fencing where appropriate, taking into account best practices described in TPWD and TxDOT habitat guidance.
  - b. Construction-phase BMPs to reduce temporary impacts (e.g., timing of clearing to avoid critical seasons, minimizing night lighting near Sensitive Habitat, erosion and sediment controls protective of aquatic habitats).
  - c. Long-term management recommendations for preserved habitat and open space, including invasive species control and vegetation management to maintain habitat quality.
- (6) Coordination Recommendations.
- a. If the WIS identifies potential adverse effects to federally-listed species or their critical habitat, a recommendation that the Applicant coordinate with USFWS as required under federal law.
  - b. If the WIS identifies potential adverse effects to state-listed species or state-priority habitats, a recommendation that the Applicant coordinate with TPWD's Environmental Review Team and/or Technical Guidance Program to refine avoidance, minimization, and mitigation measures.
- (7) Conclusion and Certification.
- a. Summary of key wildlife and habitat issues and how the proposed subdivision design and mitigation measures address those issues.
  - b. Signature and Certified Wildlife Control Professional seal (if applicable) of the Qualified Wildlife Professional certifying that the study has been prepared in accordance with this Ordinance, TPWD guidance identified in 8-944, and accepted professional standards.

**Section 6.** – Section 8-947

The City of Fulshear, Texas, adopts the Review and Approval Criteria, which shall abide by the following:

Section 8-947. - Review and Approval Criteria

- (1) Administrative Review. The City Engineer or designee shall review the WIS, in coordination with the Planning Department and other City staff or consultants as needed, to determine compliance with this Ordinance.
- (2) Consistency with State Law and TPWD Guidance. In reviewing the WIS, the City shall

consider whether:

- a. The WIS adequately identifies potential habitats and species of concern using TPWD resources and methods consistent with TPWD recommendations.
- b. The subdivision design reasonably avoids and minimizes impacts to Sensitive Habitat where practicable, consistent with the City's authority under Local Government Code Chapter 212 to promote healthful development.
- c. Proposed mitigation and BMPs are appropriate and proportional to the anticipated impacts and are generally consistent with TPWD's emphasis on avoiding impacts to natural areas and conserving remaining wildlife habitat.
- d. Required Revisions. The City may require revisions to the WIS and to the subdivision layout, open space configuration, or mitigation measures as conditions of plat approval where necessary to address substantial wildlife and habitat impacts documented in the WIS.

**Section 7.** – Section 8-948

The City of Fulshear, Texas, adopts the Enforcement and Relationship to Other Laws guidelines which shall include the following:

Section 8-948. - Enforcement and Relationship to Other Laws

- (1) Requirement Prior to Disturbance. It is unlawful to commence land clearing, grading, infrastructure construction, or other land-disturbing activity associated with a subdivision subject to this Ordinance prior to approval of the WIS and associated plat.
- (2) Violations. Violations of this Ordinance may be enforced by:
  - a. Refusal, suspension, or revocation of subdivision or construction approvals and permits.
  - b. Issuance of stop-work orders.
  - c. Assessment of fines and penalties as authorized by the City Code, with each day of violation constituting a separate offense.
- (3) No Limitation on State or Federal Authority.
  - a. Nothing in this Ordinance limits or supersedes the authority of TPWD or USFWS to administer or enforce applicable state or federal wildlife laws; project proponents remain responsible for compliance with all such laws.
  - b. Where the WIS indicates potential impacts to listed species or their habitats, it is the Applicant's responsibility to seek any required permits, approvals, or incidental take authorizations from USFWS or other agencies, and to pursue any applicable habitat conservation plans in accordance with Parks and Wildlife Code Chapter 83 and federal law.

**Section 8.** – Severability

In the event any clause, phrase, provision, sentence or part of this Ordinance or the application of the same to any person or circumstances shall for any reason be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect, impair, or invalidate this Ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part declared to be invalid or unconstitutional; and the City Council of the City of Fulshear, Texas, declares that it would have passed each and every part of the same notwithstanding the omission of any part thus declared to be invalid or unconstitutional, or whether there be one or more parts.

**Section 9.** – Repeal

All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 10.** – Effective Date

That this Ordinance shall be effective and in full effect immediately upon its adoption.

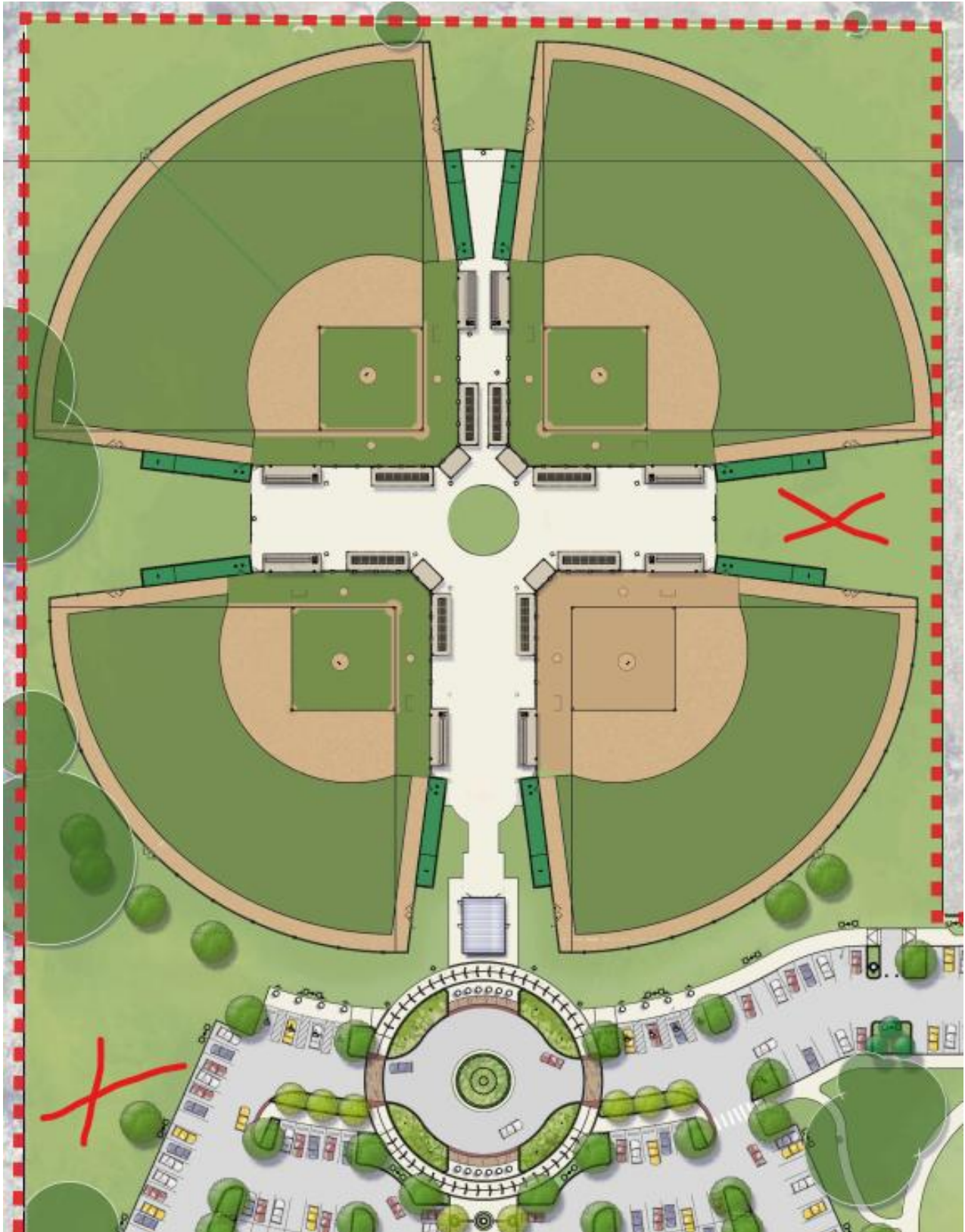
